Champion Schools Basketball comes to a climatic close!

After over 200 games of basketball across the metropolitan area the School Sport WA Senior Champion Schools Basketball competition concluded on Tuesday 26th June with the Champion and All-Schools grand finals held at Bendat Basketball Centre.

In the All-Schools Boys division CBC Fremantle and Churchlands Senior High School won their way through the very closely contested knock out rounds to reach the grand final.

Both teams seemed nervous in the early stages and in a low scoring first half CBC went to the main break up by one. After the break the aptly named Churchlands Chargers took control and piled on the points to push the lead to double digits by three quarter time. CBC tried to mount a come back in the last quarter but it was to no avail with Churchlands charging to the victory 37-50.

B.Goord from Churchlands SHS was judged the Most Valuable Player by the referees on the game.

In the Champion Schools grand final an undefeated Willetton Senior High School team, minus two of their stars who were on National duties, took on PSA winners Scotch College coached by former Men's SBL player and coach CJ Jackson. The first quarter was a close tussle with teams trading baskets for most of the quarter. Willetton went into the first break slightly ahead. From then on it was all Willetton SHS as they knocked down three after three to blow the lead out to 20+ at half time. Try as they might Scotch could not stop the onslaught as Willetton continued to do as they pleased in the second half. Willetton were not challenged in the end adding another Senior boys championship trophy to the cabinet, eventually winning 80-42.

M.Kearing from Willetton SHS was judged Most Valuable Player by the referees on the game.

Next up were the girls grand finals with Clontarf Aboriginal College taking on defending champions Mandurah Catholic College in the girls All-Schools game and Willetton taking on the defending champions Kennedy Baptist College in the Champion Schools game.

Clontarf got out of the blocks early, before some hot shooting saw Mandurah close the gap at quarter-time.

From then on it was all Mandurah as they increased their defensive intensity and pushed the ball up the floor to create a number of easy scores. Clontarf tried hard to get back into the game but ran out of puff in an entertaining grand final won by Mandurah for the second year in a row, 53-68.

Pearl Coppin from Clontarf was outstanding and justly awarded the Most Valuable Player of the game, awarded by the referees.

In the Champion Schools girls grand final Willetton were after revenge after losing in last years grand final for the first time in a number of years. Led by two mastermind coaches, Perry Lakes Hawks women's SBL head coach Deanna Smith and Perth Lynx WNBL head coach Andy Stewart, this game was always going to be an entertaining and hard fought affair. The game was intense, with both teams finding it relatively easy to score. Everytime Kennedy tried to pull away Willetton managed to get stops and score to bridge the gap. It wasn't until the third quarter when Kennedy, led by a phenomenal performance from C.Jacobs, pushed the lead out towards double digits. Try as they might Willetton did not have any answers and Kennedy made it back to back championships winning 61-48.

C.Jacobs from Kennedy Baptist was named MVP after her 30+ point performance.

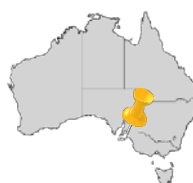
