ORIENTEERING

On 19th June perfect weather set the scene for a highly successful Go for 2 & 5 Secondary Schools' championships at Manning Park in the Shire of Cockburn. Schools from Mandurah and Bunbury commented on how much they appreciated having the event south of the city for a change, enabling them to set out an hour later than in recent years. The venue also provided terrain that was quite different from that in the past few years with less opportunity for running through the bush but many paths to be confused by and hills steep enough to test the fittest. Twenty-three schools were represented and around 450 students enjoyed courses set by Ian Fletcher. Feedback from students and teachers was very positive, with several teachers commenting "that was great", "the kids had a lot of fun" and "we'll be back next year".

Competition was quite fierce for top spots in each class with winning times being quite impressive. In the inter-school competition La Salle College edged out Quinns Baptist College by a small margin, taking home the Champion School Shield. Quinns has been second to La Salle for several years and they have been working hard to narrow the gap, but this year they had to compete with La Salle's "MacFarlane edge": Sharon and Lily (our most recent Level 1 coaches) provided 15 sessions of coaching for members of the La Salle team.

The event ran smoothly due to the unstinting help of 40 volunteers! OWA can consider itself fortunate to have so many members willing to help. Some did physically demanding jobs and some did very tedious jobs quite cheerfully. Thanks are also due to the Cockburn Shire who provided groundsmen on the morning of the event to cut back the bushes that had recently fallen at neck height over the track downhill to the last control. Financial support from Healthway was extremely helpful and we were more than happy to support their healthy eating message. The winning team were also very happy to all receive drink bottles promoting the Go for 2 & 5 message.

Now we look forward to the Primary Schools' championships on August 21st and hope that we again have such a wonderful band of supporters – and fine weather!



HOCKEY 7-9

Ross Meadows Shield (year 7-9) hockey competition saw the preliminary rounds played late in Term 2. The final between Shenton College and Bunbury Cathedral Grammar School is scheduled for Thursday 5th September @ PHS. It is to be played as the curtain raiser to the Buchanan Cup (Girls Open) and David Bell Cup (Boys Open) Finals.

Clear blue skies greeted the field of eager juniors who arrived at Kwinana Golf Club ready to represent their schools in the 2019 School Sport WA Golf WA Primary Championships.

The annual championship sees students from years 2-6 and 35 schools compete for both team and individual honours over 9 holes. The Wesley College team of Hunter Woodley-Page and Spencer Harrison took out overall honours winning the Primary School Shield with a combined Stableford score of 34. Wesley College's Hunter Woodley-Page also captured the Individual Boys' Stableford competition with a fantastic score of 20.

Thanks also to Como Secondary College coordinator Adam Smith for his tireless work and effort. Adam coordinated the seven Como Golf Academy students who came along to chaperone some of our groups.
